NOTICE TO CEASE PRACTICE

CASE NO.: 1H 2012 266

TO CARL CACCONIE:

I am the Executive Officer of the Respiratory Care Board (“Board”), Department of  
Consumer Affairs, State of California.

The licensing and regulation of respiratory care practitioners in California is governed by  
the Respiratory Care Practice Act (Business and Professions Code section 3700 et seq.). Business  
and Professions Code section 315 and California Code of Regulations section 1399.375 authorize  
the Board to order a licensee on probation to cease practice for major violations as identified in its  
Disciplinary Guidelines (California Code of Regulations section 1399.374).

Condition 18 of your probationary order states, “As part of probation, Respondent shall be  
suspended from the practice of respiratory care for a period of twelve (12) days beginning from  
the effective date of this decision....”

Pursuant to the Board’s Disciplinary Guidelines, major violations include, but are not  
limited to, failing to adhere to any suspension or restriction of practice. You committed a major  
violation by practicing respiratory care on July 15, 2013 in violation of Condition 18, Suspension,  
of your probationary order. Accordingly, you are hereby ordered to immediately cease practice  
as a respiratory care practitioner.
