Pretrial diversion ordered for unlawful possession and possessing a device, contrivance, instrument, and paraphernalia used for smoking a controlled substance. Use of a controlled substance, to wit, methamphetamine. Pursuant to a Default Decision and Order, license revoked effective October 14, 2020. View Documents

MCNARRY-RHOADS, PAMELA - RCP 26749

Provided statements of information to the Board's examining psychiatrist that were knowingly false. Respondent's ability to practice the profession safely is imparied due to mental illness. Pursuant to a Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order, license surrendered effective October 26, 2020. View Documents

MONTGOMERY. DESTINY LAYNE - RCP 39042

Convicted of child endangerment and driving under the influence of alcohol with a blood alcohol content of 0.08% or higher with a prior conviction of driving under the influence of alcohol. Pursuant to a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, license revoked, stayed, and placed on four (4) years probation effective November 12, 2020. View Documents

MICLAT. FHER-JOHN - RCP 30031

Convicted of domestic battery and previously convicted of false imprisonment. Pursuant to a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, license revoked, stayed, and placed on four (4) years probation effective December 3, 2020.

EXPLANATION OF DISCIPLINARY LANGUAGE AND ACTIONS

Effective date of decision: The date the disciplinary decision goes into operation.

Default Decision: A decision based on the licensee's failure to respond to formal charges after it has been served, or failure to appear at an Administrative Hearing. All charges are deemed true. The decision results in the revocation of the license.

Disciplinary Order: An order for discipline adopted by the Board.

Probation: Allows the licensee to practice as a respiratory care practitioner under terms and conditions for a set amount of time.

Proposed Decision: A decision rendered by an Administrative Law Judge through an Administrative Hearing. A proposed decision must be adopted by the Board before it can go into effect.

Revoked: The right to practice is ended due to disciplinary action. The license is invalidated, voided, annulled, or rescinded. The individual can no longer practice as a respiratory care practitioner in California.

Revoked, Stayed: "Stayed" means the revocation is postponed. Professional practice may continue so long as the licensee complies with specified terms and conditions of probation.

Stipulated Settlement: A form of plea bargaining. The case is formally negotiated and settled prior to a hearing.

Stipulated Surrendered: The Board agrees to allow the licensee to surrender the license as a resolution to a disciplinary matter. The individual can no longer practice as a respiratory care practitioner in California.
